On behalf of the GEA Executive Board, I'd like to say that we are honored to serve as the leaders of our local union. The support you give each other and students is an inspiration. Helping colleagues, the district, and students is what makes our professions so rewarding. Together we made a difference despite the many challenges posed by the pandemic. Last year at this time I wrote to you about the encouraging signs as we finished a difficult school year and began a much needed summer break. A couple newer waves of Covid made our jobs more interesting during the past school year. Cheryl Wright and the Nominations and Elections Committee did a nice job of securing candidates for all positions and organizing the GEA election earlier this month. The Executive Board will be returning for another term. Jim Duggan (president), Amy Thornton (first vice president), Bill Brown (second vice president), Valerie Zeh (treasurer), Sara McNamara (secretary) and Cecilia Moreau (ESP representative) remain in their positions. These individuals spent countless hours collaborating with the district, organizing for MTA initiatives, protecting your rights, negotiating agreements, and so much more.

Additionally, the GEA is fortunate enough to have talented building representatives that will pursue your interests and facilitate communication with the administration. Jen Bak and Linda Hyjek will serve as building representatives at Littleville Elementary. Denae Dostal and Brittany Passman will be the representatives for Chester Elementary. Chris Mosher and Hannah Sullivan are teaming up to be the building representatives for the Middle School. Mark Donovan and Beth Guertin will represent the High School.

Please consider volunteering to serve your association in the upcoming school year. We need people to serve on GEA committees, attend school committee meetings, organize events, and to assist one another.
